#### **Description of the organisation**

INFOREF is a non-profit association of teachers, technical and educational experts offering services to primary and secondary schools and to adult education.

INFOREF supports innovative teaching technologies and methodologies and the introduction of innovative e-Learning based educational systems.

Our staff is specialised in the field of ICT (training, creation of websites) and in the management of European projects (LLP Comenius, ICT, Leonardo da Vinci, Gruntdvig, etc.).

As project promoter, INFOREF has managed several European projects to help students with learning disabilities: Je parle donc j'écris (I speak therefore I write), Co-nai-sens (on Mental Management) and Signes@Sens (Reading, an active search for meaning). In these projects, we produced innovative tools for students and training modules for teachers to achieve basic and transversal skills.

In recent years, we have participated as partner in the following projects:

From 2010 to 2012, the LLP project I Am Not Scared, to better understand the phenomenon of school bullying and to propose relevant answers to this issue.

From 2011 to 2013, the Leonardo da Vinci project Stay@School (transfer of innovation), to develop tools and common strategies to prevent early school leaving.

Since December 2011, the Comenius – Networks actions project Chemistry is All Around Network, to promote chemistry education and collect innovative tools and practices in chemistry teaching.

Since January 2013, the Comenius multilateral project School Safety Net, to fight early school leaving through four thematic areas (spotting students at risk, helping students with learning difficulties, integrating immigrant students and tackling violent behaviours and bullying).

In May 2014 ended the Europe for Citizens project eBook, during which students visited WWII remembrance sites (concentration camps etc.) and created eBooks to share their experience.

We are currently participating as partner in four projects in the framework of the ERASMUS+ Programme: School&Work (related to school guidance), SONET-Bull (school bullying), V.I.S.I.ON (as technical partner) and Not Only Fair Play (school and sport).

Since September 2015, Inforef is coordinating two Erasmus+ projects: Vocational Guidance in CLIL (for people who consider working abroad) and SimuCarePro (simulation in health for learners and professionals).

Thanks to the projects we have been leading for more than 10 years, we cooperate with many types of institutions in Belgium and abroad: schools of all levels (primary, secondary and higher education), universities, training centres for teachers, associations, public services, etc. In Belgium, we cooperate with organisations and public authorities in charge of education and training that can support the project activities and the dissemination of its results.

We publish information about the project on our website and on the websites of various partner organisations in the field of education, citizenship and European integration. They can in turn disseminate information through their newsletters and paper publications. We also disseminate on the project to key actors of education during meetings, conferences and education-related events.

Our ICT team has created numerous website and logos for schools and non-profit organisation. They also train teachers to integrate ICT in their lessons (interactive whiteboard, tablets...) and provide computer training to groups and individuals.

#### **Experience of the organization in previous European projects**

From 2008 to 2010, we participated as partner in the Comenius Multilateral project "Routes", about the migration phenomenon and the integration of migrants in Europe.

From 2010 to 2012, we participated as partner in the KA1 project "I Am Not Scared" aiming to better understand school bullying and to propose relevant answers to this issue, which can be one of the factors of early school leaving.

From 2011 to 2013, we participated as partner in the Leonardo da Vinci project "Stay@School" (transfer of innovation), to develop tools and common strategies to prevent early school leaving.

From 2011 to 2014, we participated in the Comenius project "Chemistry is All Around Network" (multilateral

networks) dedicated to the promotion of chemistry education.

From January 2013 to December 2014, we have participated as partner in the Comenius multilateral project "School Safety Net", which aims to fight early school leaving through four areas (spotting students at risk, helping students with learning difficulties, integrating immigrant students and tackling violent behaviours and bullying).

Since 2014, Inforef has been a partner in the Erasmus+ project "School&Work", to prevent early school leaving creating synergies between school and the job market.

Since 2014, Inforef has been a partner in the Erasmus+ project "Sonet-Bull": Using ICT social networking tools with peer learning and crowdsourcing to train school

communities to counter student bullying.

Since 2015, Inforef has been a partner in the Erasmus+ project "Not Only Fair Play", to help students balance education and sport.

Climatic (2005-2007): a virtual climatic laboratory to make young people aware of the problem of climate change and sustainable development while familiarising them with the scientific method.

Energ@tic (2007-2010): the Virtual Energ@tic Laboratory proposed primary and secondary school students a series of challenges to save energy starting from familiar situations.

Chemistry is All Around Network (2011-2014): creation of a European network to promote chemistry education among secondary school students, using innovative teaching methods and technologies. This project involved the collection of papers, publication, best practices and online resources related to science and chemistry education. IN this framework, Inforef also created teaching resources and trained teachers to use them.

TICE-Sciences (2014-2015): local project based on the working group of teachers formed during the "Chemistry is All Around Network" project. It involves the creation of teaching sequences for science lessons.
