

E-learning from Nature

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Abstract

In summary of the project and expected outcomes: The E-Learning from Nature project is funded by the European Commission and the Italian National Agency for the Erasmus+ Programme with the aims of: Promoting a proactive students' approach to scientific subjects learning; Proposing innovative teaching methodologies to scientific teachers. The project portal is being developed to give access to: A database of local areas relevant for the study of science subjects; E-learning lessons related to the local areas; A teachers guide aiming at Proposing teaching methodologies based on real life case scenarios; Enhancing students' scientific basic skills acquisition through their active involvement in the learning process and promoting the value of peer-assisted learning; Making use of new technologies to promote the scientific knowledge; Promoting transnational cooperation for school science teaching and learning.

Key achievements and outputs

Each partner has involved five schools in their country, as well as a number of associated partners. The Irish schools participating in the project are St Caimin's Community School Shannon, Glenstal Abbey School, Tallaght Community School, St Mary's Glasnevin, St Joseph's Borrisoleigh. The final set of short E-lessons is practically completed. The final version of the E-book — a handbook of useful links for teaching and learning — is at the proof reading stage. Three transnational meetings have been held to plan each stage of the project.
